- ➤ Don't have to know all the answers
- OK to feel embarrassed
- ▶ OK to answer late
- Give facts and a range of opinion.
- ▶ Be concrete, graphic
- Use repetition
- ▶ Use the media, soap opera support group




Practice Answering Factual Questions







